### **BENEFIT/OUTCOME SUMMARY BY PROGRAM**

**Program 1: Continuing Education/Annual Meeting** 

Narrative:

This program supports Goals #1 and #2 of the Broad Valleys Federation

Annual Meeting – Members voted to continue meeting once a year for a two-day meeting, location of which is within the boundaries of the Federation. Retreat will include a minimum of two continuing education workshops. Goal: to increase attendance at annual retreat by 10%.

Each library will receive \$37.50 to help defray travel costs to the meeting.

The Lewis & Clark Library will coordinate and pay for the costs of lodging, meals and continuing education presentations. As costs have risen and there is higher attendance at the retreat, the Federation approved an increase to cover retreat costs. The Lewis & Clark Library will receive up to \$4,155 to pay for this service.

Unexpended funds from any program may be redirected. Remaining funds may be used to secure additional continuing education /professional development opportunities, online databases, MontanaLibrary2Go, book discussion kits, or technology that benefits the Federation.

This program provides funding to cover lodging and meals for member librarians and trustees to attend the annual Federation retreat, which includes an annual business meeting and continuing education opportunities. In FY 2011, close to 50 librarians and trustees attended all or part of the retreat. The retreat is an opportunity for Federation members to network, share ideas and discuss challenges. The Federation welcomed new Library Directors Mitch Grady, Hearst Free, Anaconda; Tammy Brawn, Livingston-Park County; and Khrys Suckow, William Kohrs, Deer Lodge.

Dual continuing education tracks were offered, one for trustees, one for librarians. Attendees could earn up to 5 hours of CE credits. Special guest Nicole Engard, Director of Open Source Education at ByWater Solutions, presented a session on open source software in libraries, providing attendees with a toolbox full of freely available open source products to use in their libraries. Continuing education opportunities for our librarians and trustees is a crucial component of the annual retreat and also offers trustees an opportunity to meet and network with their counterparts.

The annual business meeting was held on Saturday. The FY 2012 Plan of Service was reviewed and approved, BVF librarians presented individual library reports, the State Library presented their spring report, and election of officers for FY 2012 was held.

The annual BVF meeting is used to allow Broad Valleys Federation Libraries to share the information, knowledge and resources available to the Federation and encourage networking and consensus building.

The new Library Director was able to meet colleagues in the region and learn more about how Montana libraries operate.

Networking with others, informative meetings on MontanaLibrary 2Go and MSC.

The annual meeting provides wonderful networking opportunities for both librarians to learn from their peers and discuss current library trends in Montana.

New library board member learned about E-rate and applied the info to understand the monthly phone bill and the overview on launching a levy campaign will be applied once the Library Foundation is in place and fundraising begins toward a new library. Library Director received hands-on training with Google, alternative search engines, subject-specific resources, archives, web guides and other free online tools which has been used frequently in the library. Both were exposed to open source software available to libraries - a subject neither had prior knowledge of.

Assist in cost to travel to meeting for continuing education credits and business meeting.

There is not enough space to record all the benefits that I receive from attending the annual federation meeting. I received excellent education opportunities and had a wonderful time networking with other librarians from the area.

Attending meeting and networking with fellow librarians of Southwest Montana.

Our library was unable to attend BVF in March. \$37.50 was redirected to a trip to Missoula for the Montana Shared Catalog meeting in May 2011. We have been members of the MSC since 2004. It is a great benefit to us to share with and borrow from others, as well as to have our holdings in a catalog. We are only able to travel to one of the yearly meetings.

We appreciate the funds to attend MLA. We are able to send both library staff to the conference. It is always a valuable experience and opportunity for us.

As a new library director, the information and networking was incredibly helpful!

#### **Program 2: Continuing Education Grants**

Narrative:

This program supports Goals #1 and #2 of the Broad Valleys Federation. Each library will receive a direct grant of \$474.10 to be used to provide continuing education to librarians and trustees, at the discretion of each individual library.

Unexpended funds from any program may be redirected. Remaining funds may be used to secure additional continuing education /professional development opportunities, online databases, MontanaLibrary2Go, book discussion kits, or technology that benefits the Federation.

From "If We Build It...Digital Content" to "Customer Service Guidelines" and "Understanding Copyright Law", the 2011 Montana Library Association Conference offered a variety of valuable, and practical professional development opportunities for staff and trustees. Funding for professional development and continuing education is imperative. Lewis & Clark Library recently completed an organizational wide targeted planning process that has resulted in constructive changes to our physical plant as well as our circulation processes. The process also gave all staff a voice and a greater sense of collaboration and teamwork. Another benefit of continuing education, we are now in the process of a new approach to collection analysis. This method looks at usage compared to collection size to build a customer oriented collection.

The annual conference is a marvelous opportunity to learn about new library information and increase our skills. Thank you!

We will be able to help students out with their homework by using the authoritative searching. We can also help our patrons obtain free programs through open source sharing. With the use of mobile apps, our patrons can search our catalog for items they would like and they can place their own holds on the items. We also were able to start a "Books and Babies" program to help parents understand how important early reading and learning are.

Staff attended various workshops/training-- enhancing their current positions which in turn would provide better customer service for library patrons.

All these funds were used to pay travel to the conference this year. Two staff members traveled to each conference for continuing ed. This included Chico retreat as well. We had two new staff people and this was a great way for them to meet their peers and take advantage of training.

Hotel room for Library Director to attend MLA conference in Billings. Library Director could not have attended the annual Montana Library Association without this grant. Her attendance keep continuing education updated and allows for a networking opportunity with other Montana librarians.

Travel expenses to attend training and sessions at the annual Federation meeting in Butte with the new assistant librarian and Trustee Chairman. The sessions were especially beneficial to Zoe, the new assistant librarian as this was her first experience with library training and networking. Trustee Shelley Johnson gained insight during the track for trustees as well as the overwhelming amount of information from the guest speaker on open source. I gained knowledge as well from the sessions I attended and also was able to help in sharing with other libraries, the process for passing a levy.

This was money was used to attend Montana State Library Fall Workshop (Great Falls) and MLA Spring Meeting (Billings). Mitch Grady attended several workshops and sessions, all of which directly related to the library.

The library sent 3 staff members to the Offline conference (in Helena) and 3 staff members to the Montana Library Association conference (in Billings). Helped defray registration and travel expenses. One staff member, who has been here over 7 years, had never attended an Offline conference. She returned very excited about what she learned and determined she was not nearly as backward on technology as she had feared. All staff persons who attended these continuing education workshops found them informative and useful to their work.

The MLA conference benefited Kari and Trudy by providing seminars and invaluable training that will benefit all patrons at MCS Library. Both librarians took advantage of the many offerings concerning new technology.

Several workshop sessions were put to immediate use upon return: New Technologies & Libraries info was used assisting patrons with Kindles and new mobile devices and the Cataloging session provided timely information used to weed the library collection which is now 75% complete. Library Marketing 101 resulted in newspaper advertising of the Books for Babies program and other areas of the library, a picture poster in the library, and more exchange at the circulation desk regarding the library's programs and services. Rousing Reads provided insight on books which were ordered and added to the library's Montana collection. Offline continues yearly to be invaluable for providing continual patron assistance on computer operation questions and technology.

#### **Program 3: Technology and Resource Sharing**

Narrative:

This program supports Goals # 2 and #3 of the Broad Valleys Federation. Each library will receive a direct grant of \$1,033.70. Monies will be used for technology related expenses. Emphasis will be on technology that strengthens federation-wide access. Additional emphasis will be on federation wide resource sharing and document delivery. Monies received in this category will be expended for such things as hardware, software, OCLC expenditures, statewide database expenditures, virtual reference, and shared catalog expenses.

Each member library may designate some or all of their technology funds for Federation wide purchase of Heritage Quest.

Unexpended funds from any program may be redirected. Remaining funds may be used to secure additional continuing education /professional development opportunities, online databases, MontanaLibrary2Go, book discussion kits, or technology that benefits the Federation.

The stipend provides funding to support ongoing communication with Federation libraries and to cover costs of supplies for annual retreat, including photocopying. It also covered the costs for the annual retreat that were over and above the allotment under Program 1.

The Shared Catalog continues to increase in popularity around the State as patrons realize the great benefit to having access to materials available around Montana. The catalog is fundamental to our services.

Our patrons can now search for their families online from the library as well as their homes. We have a dedicated group of geneologist's who love this program.

We have WorldBook Online to help kids with their homework and reference questions. They can also use this program from their homes. With so many patrons receiving E-Reader's this year, almost all the E-books were always checked out. With the purchase of more E-books, patrons have less waiting time for their books.

Original cataloging provides access to rare items which is beneficial to all. Benefits the community for presentations, use in the library, classroom, and library staff for services to the public.

We used these funds to keep our most important electronic resources paid for. In a year of so many budgeted costs it was great to have these funds to count on. Because we are a full cataloging library, this is a great help.

OCLC allows DPL access to a cataloging database and access to World Cat to enable us to provide ILL service to our patrons. Both services enhance our ability to provide access to materials for our patrons. Being a member of the Montana Shared Catalog allows DPL access to a more sophisticated ILS than we could ever afford on our own. In addition, we receive software maintenence, all modules of an integrated libary system, access to trainings, etc. As other expenses rise, this yearly fee becomes more and more difficult to cover without the support of our Federation grant.

As a member of OCLC, member libraries are given a means to share their library's collections and resources through OCLC's online ILL system.

Continuing to participate in OCLC allows our Library to have more detailed cataloging records and more easily provide ILL services. Without this OCLC subscription, our staff would have much more work to do, some of which would certainly fall by the wayside due to time and staffing limits.

Belonging to MSC benefits staff and patrons. Allowed MVPL to continue with the 4Rivers Sharing Group.

The Montana Shared Catalog has opened up the doors to thousands of books to our Manhattan Patrons. We are in a sharing group with Belgrade, Bozeman, Three Forks and West Yellowstone and this allows our patrons to borrow books from all of these libraries. We share our books with these libraries as well. This is just one of the many benefits.

Our library treasures the existence of the MSC for so many reasons. The Symphony Consortia Integrated Library System provides easy location of library materials, excellent cataloging resources, and management tools we rely heavily upon during day by day operation of the library. Director's Station continues to provide needed information to our city/county officials.
