When school libraries participate in shared collections, students benefit from instant access to perhaps thousands of ebooks and digital audiobooks at the click of a button. While easy access to a rich repository of digital content gives students a valuable resource for research and extracurricular reading, not all content in the shared repository may be appropriate for school-age readers.*

Member libraries can customize their Axis 360 sites, excluding material based on BISAC subject categories and audience levels, while retaining the option of whitelisting individual authors whose material they may want to preserve in their collection. Once scoping filters are put in place, only material that meets your curation settings will be displayed and available for your students.

This enhancement gives libraries extraordinary control over their digital collections while allowing school libraries to benefit from the pooled purchasing power of the public, academic and special libraries in their sharing group.
